Thip's full name is Chortip Janga, she is Black Lahu, 16 years old, and has no real home village.

Thip has a beautiful voice and loves to sing and play guitar.

She can understand some English but is too shy to speak what she knows; however, she will not hesitate to sing along to English songs.

Thip's family is scattered and she does not know where most of them are. Her parents are divorced and they both abandoned their daughters, while the girls were very young. Thip and her four sisters all grew up in Children's homes.

Thip was raised in a Destiny Rescue children's home from the age of 6 years old, and that home has now shut down, leaving her without any support to meet her basic needs or continue the Tourism program she had already started at Chiang Rai Vocational College.

Thip had completed one year of a five-year program at the school before she lost her support system. She thought her best option for survival was to go to her sister's village and marry herself off to someone she didn't know, then we told her she had another option, and when she realized we would help her, she cried tears of joy.

Thip is hoping to become more confident with her English skills and to finish her program in Tourism so that she can become a Tour Guide. English speaking tour guides make three to four times higher wages than the Thai minimum wage of 300 Baht per day (about \$12 Cad per day), With your support Thip's hope can become a reality.
